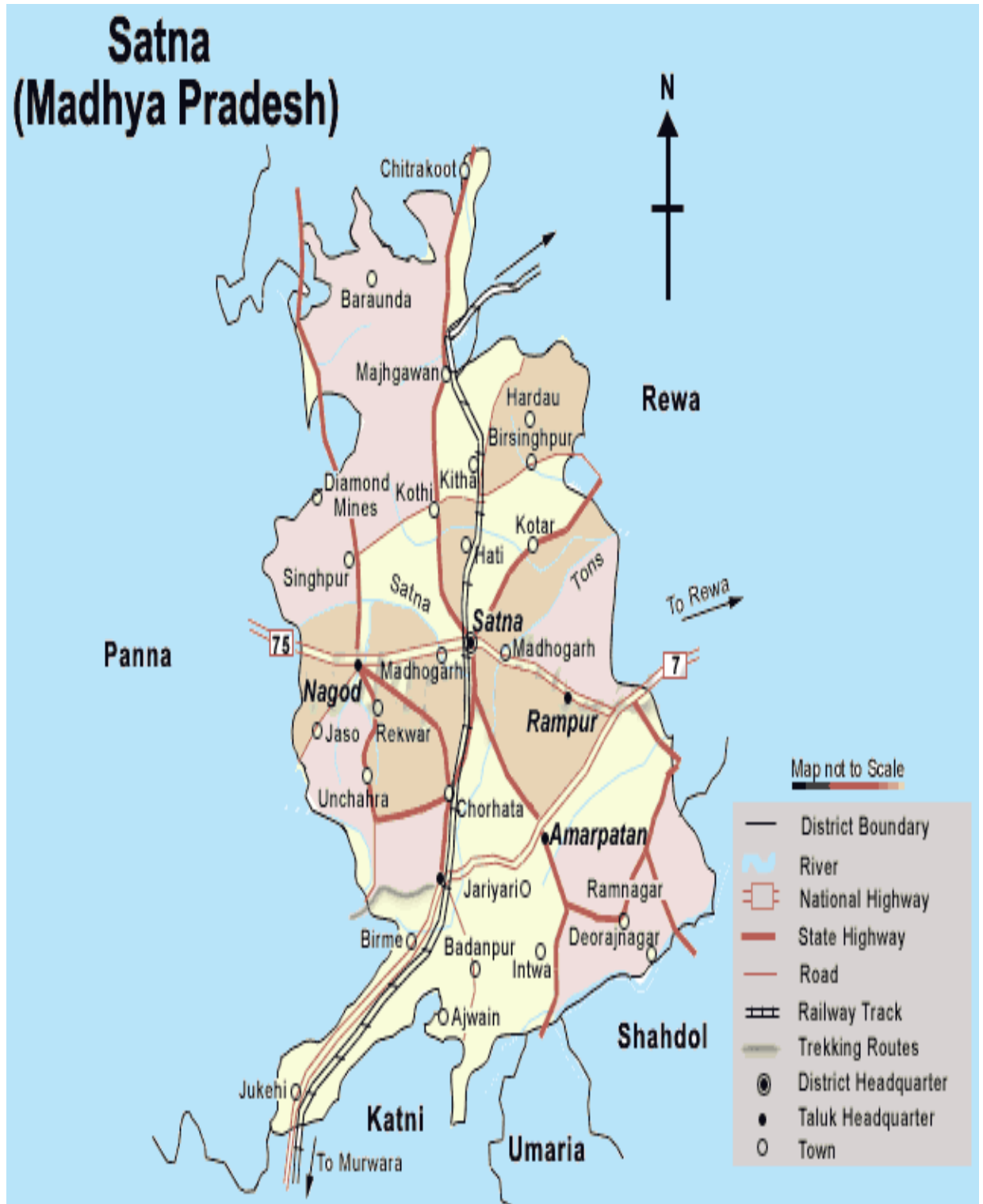

Satna is a district in the north – eastern border of Madhya Pradesh under the Rewa division. Satna presently consists 8 Sub division & 10 Tahsil. Its an important industrial and commercial district alongwith the pressure of sacred places like Chitrakoot, Maihar, Ramvan & Birsinghpur.

The Northern boundary of the district is with Banda district of UP, Eastern Border touches Rewa and Sidhi districts of MP, Southern Border touches Shahdol & Katni districts of MP and Western border is formed with Panna district of MP.

Satna has significant presence of limestone and its related Cement industries. Pulses and wheat are the major crops of the region. Population in Satna Practices either agriculture or is involved in labor activities. The atmosphere of district with respect to election is peaceful.

- **Peculiarities in Demography-**

According to the 2011 census Satna District has a population of 2,228,619, roughly equal to the nation of Latvia or the US state of New Mexico. This gives it a ranking of 203rd in India (out of a total of 640). The district has a population density of 251 inhabitants per square kilometre (770/sq mi). Its population growth rate over the decade 2001-2011 was 19.17%. Satna has a sex ratio of 927 females for every 1000 males, and a literacy rate of 73.79%.

In the 2001 census, Satna district had a total population of 1,868,648. Decadal growth in 1991-2001 was 27.52. Sex ratio was 926. Density of population was 249 / km<sup>2</sup>. The Demography characteristics point out that majority of population is rural approximately 78.71% and only approx 21.28% urban. The majority of rural population is contributed by Maihar and Nagod Subdivisions while the urban population mainly resides in Raghurajnagar subdivision which includes the district headquarter.

**Languages-**

Among the languages spoken in Satna is Bagheli, which has a lexical similarity of 72-91% with Hindi (compared to 60% for German and English) and is spoken by about 7,800,000 people in Bagelkhand.

**Location** :-The districts takes its name from Satna, the head quarters town, which in its turn takes it from Satna river which flows near the town. In the north the district boundary marches with that of Banda District of Uttar Pradesh state. Eastern border of the district runs with the Teonthar, Sirmour and Huzur Tehsils of Rewa district and a very small section of the Gopadbanas tehsil of Sidhi District. The entire western boundary of the district is made by Panna district while the southern boundary abuts on the Murwara tehsil of Katni district in the west and Bandhogarh tehsil of Umaria district and Beohari Tehsils of Shahdol district on the east

**Physical Features** :- Satna district lies on Vindhyan Plateau, which has an average altitude of 1000' to 11000'. The southern portion of Nagod Tehsil below 24°30' north latitude is a hilly country consisting of a tangled mass of low hills, and enclosing considerable stretches of level ground. The general slope of the country of the tehsil is towards the east, inclined towards the north in the centre of the tehsil.

**Satna**, the important river of the tehsil rises from the Panna hills and flows east as long as it is in Nagod tehsil. Near village Kathkone in Nagod Tehsil it is joined by the Amran river, and from this point of junction, it bends towards the south, making the boundary of Nagod and Raghuraj Nagar tehsils, till it meets the Tons river a few miles to the south-east of Satna town. Barua is another river of some importance in the tehsil, which rises from the hills in the south of the tehsil and flowing almost due west joins the Tons a few miles below village Karaia, at the border of Maihar and Nagod tehsils.

**Amarpatan** Tehsil is bounded on the south by the 'Son' river. The Kaimur ridge, with its scarp side to the south, rises suddenly like a wall about eight miles to the north of Son river, going towards the east, with slight northerly inclination, almost parallel to the Son river. Rest of Amarpatan tehsil is again an alluvial plain drained by the Behar river, which flows more or less parallel to the Mirzapur road, in a north-eastern direction.

The south western **Maihar** tehsil consists mainly of sandstones of Bhandar series, concealed in great part by alluvium. The Kaimur ridge runs through the heart of the broader eastern portion of the tehsil dividing the basin of the Mahanadi from that of the Tons. The river Tons, which drains the tehsil runs between the railway line and the Kaimur and is joined by numerous small nullahs which run along the northern slopes of the Kaimur. The south eastern extremity of Maihar tehsil is bound by river Mahanadi, which marches with the boundary of Maihar tehsil first with Murwara tehsil of Katni district and then with Beohari tehsil of Shahdol district.

**Raghuraj Nagar** tehsil consists in the south of an alluvial plain watered by the Tons and its tributaries the Satna, and the Simrawal from the north-west and the Magardha and Nar from the south. The Panna hills cross the narrowest portion of the tehsil and separate the valley of the Paisuni. Further north is Vindhya range running from west to east, almost parallel to the Panna hills.

#### Mountains And Hills :-

The Kaimurs, the Panna hills, and the Vindhya ranges, all belonging to the Vindhya system together with their spurs constitute the principal hills of the district. The Kaimur range enters Maihar tehsil of the district at village Jhukehi on the border of Murwara tehsil, and runs through the entire length of Maihar and Amarpatan tehsil in an easterly direction slightly inclined to the north. At Jhukehi, the strike of the Kaimurs is displaced, producing the only gap in the whole length of the Vindhyas. Advantage of the gap is taken in the construction of the Mirzapur road and the Jabalpur-Allahabad section of Bombay -Calcutta railway line.

#### Rivers :-

Tons, Son, and Paisuni are the important rivers of the district draining into the Bay of the Bengal through the Ganga. The Kymore and the Panna hills act as water-divides. Most of the rivers flow towards the east, with an inclination towards the north. The Simrawal and the Satna rivers are, however, inclined towards the south.

**Tons** (or Tamasa) is the main river of the district, it rises in the Kaimur hill in the Maihar tehsil, its nominal source, called Tamasa Kund being a tank on the Kaimur hills, 2,000 feet above the sea-level. From the point it follows a general north-easterly course, traversing the rough hilly country around Maihar, flowing through the level fertile country of the Amarpatan and Raghuraj Nagar tehsil, and then enters the Rewa district. **Satna** an important affluent of the Tons, rises in the Panna hills, flows through the northern, narrower portion of the Nagod tehsil almost in a due west-east direction and bends towards the south from the point where it is joined by Aman river. **Simrawal**, another important affluent of the Tons, flows south of Kothi in Raghuraj Nagar tehsil. The **Son**, the great river to the south of the Kymore hills does not actually enter the district but makes the southern boundary of Amarpatan tehsil with Beohari tehsil of Shahdol district. It is joined by the Mahanadi river, which flows along the boundary of Maihar and Beohari tehsils just at the point where the Son takes a turn towards the east between villages Sakwari and Bamaraha.

#### Forest -

Forest in the district are included in the Rewa forest division with headquarters at Rewa. Forests, which are mostly mixed forests extend over four ranges with headquarters at Satna, Majhgawan (both in Raghuraj Nagar tehsil) Nagod and Maihar. Approximately 27% of the area of the district is covered with forests.

- **Socio-economic – cultural peculiarities –**

Satna district at present consists of 8 sub division and 10 tahsils. The parliamentary constituency of satna is 09 SATNA in consist of 07 Assembly constituency namely 61 Chitrakoot, 62 Raigaon, 63 Satna, 64 Nagod, 65 Maihar, 66 Amarpatan and 67 Rampur Baghelan. The geographical location of the above constituency is given as under-

**61 Chitrakoot** : Assembly Constituency area 61 Chitrakoot is situated 78 km to the north of district headquarter. The northern boundary of the Assembly Constituency borders Karvy and Banda districts of Uttar Pradesh. Mandakini river originates in Chitrakoot. Its a sacred pilgrimage place where Lord Ram resided for a long period. Hence the place is significant for fairs which continues for 5 days during Adhik Maas and Amavasya and 1 week in Deepavali. Approximately 50 lakh pilgrims visit the area during this period hence maintenance of crowd becomes important during that time.

During the fair, the District Administration and police alongwith police personnel from other districts is busy in maintaining law and order in the area. Sarbhangmuni Ashram and Gaivinath dham shivalaya come under the jurisdiction of constituency which oversees heavy footfalls of pilgrims on every Monday and Purnima. 40% area of Assembly Constituency is under mountains and forest which consists of majority of tribals and backward.

The conduct of Election becomes a challenge during above festival periods.

**62 Raigaon** : Assembly Constituency area is situated 22 kilometres to the Northwest of district headquarter. The same Northwest boundary touches Panna district which is approximately 45 kilometres from district headquarters. About 15 polling station from this border are covered under forest and mountainous area.

The conduct of Election doesn't have any challenges in the region.

**63 Satna** : This area is the Assembly Constituency area of district headquarter. It consists of the entire City as well as 50 polling stations of rural areas, the approximate distance of these rural areas from district headquarter is about 15 km.

The conduct of Election is possible peacefully in the region.

**64 Nagod**: Assembly Constituency area is situated 25 km from district headquarter. The above area has its western boundary with Panna district, in order to reach 5 polling station of this constituency, one has to get travel for 22 km in Panna district. The presence of Karmdesgwarnath shivalaya on Surdaha mountain brings pilgrims on Purnima and Mondays. Approximately 35% of the area is mountainous and plateau region. The area contains majority of tribals.

A part from long travelling distances on account of terrain, the area is peaceful for conduct of elections.

**65 Maihar**: The Assembly Constituency area is situated 35 kilometres from district headquarters. Maihar is a sacred pilgrimage of Goddess Sharda on Trikut mountain. It oversees footfall of huge number everyday. Special arrangements are made to handle huge crowd during Navaratri and Purnima days. District Administration and police including from other districts are needed to maintain law and order situation during special occasions and New Year.

Conduct of elections becomes a challenge during heavy tourist arrivals. Hence, the election days must avoid coinciding with festival times.

**66 Amarpatan:** The Assembly Constituency area is situated 35 kilometres from district headquarter. The Eastern Boundary touches Sidhi district in some areas whereas a large part borders Rewa district. The southern boundary of the Assembly Constituency has Bansagar Dam, the eastern end has some polling station on Sidhi and Shahdol border. These are approximately 90 km from district headquarter.

The conduct of Election doesn't have any challenges in the region.

**67 Rampur baghelan:** The above Assembly Constituency is situated 25 km from district headquarter. The Northern and Eastern Boundary of this area touches Rewa District. The above area consists of Ramvan pilgrimage place, this place has continuous visits from pilgrims all year round.

The maintenance of order during elections is possible without any challenges in the conduct of elections.

- **Places, which are inaccessible or difficult to reach-**

Satna has "09 Satna" as its Parliamentary Constituency and 7 Assembly constituency like 61 Chitrakoot, 62 Raigaon, 63 Satna, 64 Nagod, 65 Maihar, 66 Amarpatan & 67 Rampur Baghelan.

All polling Station under above assembly constituency are connected with a road network of 2000 km. across Satna with combined capacity of Kaccha & Pakka roads. None of the polling stations is inaccessible except for long travelling distances to over come terrain difficulties.

- **Weather and periods, places of inaccessibility –**

Satna district has all weather connectivity to all its sub-divisions, assembly constituencies and the polling stations. The weather and accessibility does not pose any challenge to the conduct of elections.

- **General Law and Order Situation Constituency wise –**

The district has 8 Revenue & 7 Police sub-divisions and 22 police stations. The crime rate of the district is considered to be low in comparison with the scenario in the other Baghelkhandi districts. However the district faced problems relating to dacoit infestation during the recent past. Parts of the Sub division Majhgawa is declared sensitive and dacoit prone. The problem of dacoits has however been brought under control recently due to strong anti-dacoit operations which resulted in the elimination of all the notable leaders of dacoit groups. As of today the problem of dacoits seems to be have been minimized with no incident of dacoity been reported in the preceding four months.

Thana Majhgawan and Baroundh share about 50 km length of their boundries with District Karvi (Chhitrakoot) (U.P.). Most part of this area are covered with dense forest, mountain and valleys.

From the point of Assembly Election 2018, it is expected that the elections would be largely peaceful as per the experience from the past elections.

There is no any breakage in law and order noted recently. So at present the condition of law & order is normal and is being watched continuously.

**1. AC 61- Chitrakoot :**

Most of the areas of Chitrakut Assembly constituency are forest laden and dacoit prone. Thus, incidents of kidnapping, loot, robbery and booth capturing can not be ruled out. Polling parties have to face tough situations while reaching polling booths in these areas. Therefore, there has been immense pressure upon voters to cast their votes in favour of some influential persons or particular political parties. This area is bordering with UP, thus giving possibility of influx of criminals and dacoits coming from bordering districts of UP. These anti -social elements create pressure upon voters to cast their votes in favour of candidates of some political parties.

**2. AC 62- Raigaon (S.C.) :**

This Assembly constituency is reserved for Scheduled caste candidate. There has been constant rift between supporters of BJP and BSP in this Assembly constituency. Supporters of both parties try to influence voters in their own way, thus causing controversial situations. Therefore, disputes can not be ruled out.

**3. AC 63- Satna :**

This Assembly constituency is mostly represented by municipal areas of Satna city. There has been contests between Congress and BJP workers. Supporters of BSP are very much active in city's slum areas, thus giving speculations of the rift between supporters of BJP, BSP and Congress .This AC may witness political conflicts among candidates of BSP, BJP and Congress.

**4. AC 64- Nagod :**

This AC is mostly dominated by Kshatriya (Thakurs). There has been good number of Khushwaha and Lodhi voters in this area. There has been state of conflicts regarding votes between kushwaha and kshatriya people.

**5. AC 65- Maihar :**

Brahmins and Patel dominate the area. There has been reports of conflicts regarding votes between Brahmins and Patels.

**6. AC 66- Amarpatan :**

In this AC Brahmins, Patel and Kshatriya reside in numbers. They are dominant castes. Therefore, there has been constant tussle among these three castes. There has been reports of some incidents in the last assembly election regarding caste dominance . This constituency is bordering with Rewa district thus giving opportunities to criminal and anti- social elements to make their presence felt. These elements often try to obtain political gains out of group conflicts.



**7. AC 67- Rampur Baghelan :**

This AC is predominantly dominated by Kshatriyas and Brahmins. There has been political conflicts among supporters of BJP, Congress and BSP. Caste conflicts can not be ruled out. This constituency is bordering with Rewa district thus giving opportunities to criminal and anti- social elements to make their presence felt. These elements often try to obtain political gains out of group conflicts.

**Past Electoral Offences**

No election related violence has been reported in the previous assembly elections held in 2013 nor in the PC elections held in the year 2014.
